

**CITY OF GREENDALE
Public Hearing
February 14, 2018**

Mayor Weiss opened the Public Hearing at 7:00pm.

City Atty. Smart stated that tonight was the first reading for the proposed amendment to the City of Greendale Code of Ordinances, Title V, Chapter 52: Solid Waste.

City Mgr. Lampert went through the amendments.

Mayor Weiss asked if there were any audience comments. There were none.

Councilman Libbert expressed his concerns on some of the language in the 2/1/18 draft amendments. The Mayor concluded that the containers will have serial numbers that will be cross-referenced to the residence.

Mayor Weiss asked if there was any public comments or questions.

Councilman Wilson asked if there were different sizes for containers. City Mgr. Lampert stated that residents had a choice of 64 gal or 97 gal containers.

Councilman Karsteter asked if the containers were going to be two different colors. City Mgr. Lampert replied that the garbage will be brown and the recycling will be green.

Councilman Libbert asked if someone buys an extra trash container is it the city's property. Mayor Weiss replied that the first container is the city's property and if someone purchases a second container it is the resident's property. Councilman Libbert commented that the proposed Ordinance did not read this way. City Atty Smart indicated that he would change the language in the Ordinance to make it clearer.

There was lengthy discussion about ownership and wear and tear of the first container the City has issued to residents. In conclusion, Mayor Weiss stated language in the proposed amendment will be cleaned up.

Councilman Karsteter asked if the City would continue to assist the elderly with special needs. City Mgr. Lampert stated that they will continue to assist. Residents just need to call the Utility Office and get on a list.

Bill Taylor, from the audience, asked about the color of the containers. Mayor Weiss stated that the container used has to be the container that the City has given them.

Lastly, there was discussion about larger items being put in the trash container. City Mgr. Lampert replied that recycling does not require a trash bag; residents just need to put recycling in container. Residents need to put trash in the trash container. Councilman Libbert asked that language in the amendment be clarified. Mayor Weiss asked Councilman Libbert to write down his concerns and email them to him so they could be addressed.

There being no further business to come before the board, Councilman Karsteter made a motion to adjourn. With a second by Councilman Abbott, the motion carried by voice 7-0.




